TRAINING TIPS *with* PHIL HAUGEN



Making a Good living in the Horse Business

This is subject that came up not too long ago when I was working with a young group of trainers that ride for one of my customers. Making the horse business a career definitely comes with some challenges and a lot of blood, sweat, and tears, but it also is a labor of love and comes with many rewards. I started riding horses for the public in 1981 at my Dad's place in North Dakota, I was sixteen at the time and a sophomore in High School. Looking back at the past 36 years since that time I so wish I would've known then what I know now, lol, Oh how much smoother that road could have been. However, now I enjoy and look forward to helping trainers, breeders, Equine facility owners, etc. on shortening their learning curve to becoming profitable based off of my experiences in this business over the past 36 years. It ultimately comes down to a simple math equation of Gross Revenue minus Expenses = Net Income, however there are many components of management that go into generating revenue and managing expenses. To be profitable in this business I think it's smart to develop multiple revenue streams that can continue to be developed over time, this limits your risk of relying on just one stream of income. I'll use my current business for an example, my revenue streams come from: Training income, Clinics and lessons, Private treaty horse sales, For the last 4 years we had a production sale, I do Equine Dentistry for one particular Vet Clinic, We have some rental income from our facility, and I still shoe our personal horses and some of my customer horses that are in training. Now, remember it took me 36 years to develop those income streams and if I knew then what I know now I could've easily cut that time in half. Everybody has things that they are really good at and you need to

focus and develop those talents and provide that niche to others. There's a saying that I've always remembered, "THERE'S RICHES IN THE NICHE". This simply means develop the talents and the resources you have and become a resource for others to use to better themselves, their horses, or simply to provide them a place to board their horse. Once you've figured out the income streams you are going to develop then you can start looking at managing your expenses based off the revenue flow you will have. Managing expenses and time management is one of my really strong points. I love the challenge of managing my facility to where it's as efficient as it can be. I am constantly looking at daily operations and thinking of ways I can do one of two things, get more done in less time, and keep expenses at a minimum. Currently I have one part time person that is responsible for stall maintenance and feeding, and I have one person that helps on an as needed basis. I employ no full time help and most days are just normal 8-9 hour days for me. Whether your operation is a business or just for personal use your time is very valuable and should not be taken for granted. Life is precious and time flies, make the most of it! I hope this helps and maybe gets you thinking outside the box. Until next time, Be Safe and Have a Merry and Blessed Christmas!

KYLIE WEAST

carries on family tradition...

First time Wrangler National Finals Rodeo qualifier, Kylie Weast, is carrying on her family's legacy as she prepares to make the trek from Comanche, Oklahoma to Las Vegas, Nevada. The 30-year-old will be joining her grandmother Florence Youree, her mother Renee Ward, and her older sister Janae Ward-Massey when she adds her first WNFR qualification to her incredibly impressive resume. Janae won the World Champion Gold Buckle in 2003 and Weast could very well join her at the table of World Champions, especially riding the explosive and talented Hell On The Red.

Hell On The Red "Reddy" is a product of the Youree Ward Barrel Horse Program and is by JL Dash Ta Heaven and out of Designer Ruby by Designer Red. The 6-year-old mare is in a league of her own, incredibly talented and as gritty as they come. But she didn't do all the heavy lifting getting Weast to the WNFR. Weast also piloted Namgis D 15 throughout the year when she needed to give "Reddy" some well-deserved rest. Namgis D 15 "Wolfie" is a 9-year-old gelding by Bucks Hancock Dude

and out of Central Station by First Down Dash.

"Reddy has come a long-ways. It takes quite a bit to contain her, but she has seasoned really well this year," explained Weast. "Wolfie stepped up when I needed him, and he is a pleasure to have around. My little boy can ride him with me and that makes him worth his weight in gold."

When asked what she believes makes "Reddy" a winner, Weast explains that it's her grit and try.

"Reddy's try is what makes her such a winner. She is incredibly gritty. My mom was spot on when she said, 'It's not always perfect, but she tries perfectly.'"

Making the Finals this year was unexpected for Weast, especially since her top priority this year was to season "Reddy" and see how she liked the rodeo atmosphere. The dynamic duo entered Denver and Fort Worth, winning rounds at both prestigious rodeos and placing in the average. After that, they decided to pursue it further.

"I hit a barrel at Austin to place, and I had to decide if I was going to continue going as much. My mom and I both decided that we had the horse, so we kept entering. We then went on to win Guymon and place at a few good rodeos including Reno, Nampa, and Dodge City."

Weast's mother and 2-year-old son Marcus are always in the truck when Weast loads up to head to the next rodeo, and she admits that having the two of them with her make the wins that much sweeter and the losses that much easier.

"We try and have a great time no matter what. We keep on trucking after every run and we talk about how we could make it better the next run. Having their support, along with my husband Jay, and the rest of my families, means the absolute world to me and there is no way that I could do any of this without them."

With the first performance right around the corner, the excitement and nerves are starting to set in.

"I think that I am starting to realize what has happened, what it means, and what an accomplishment it really is," said Weast. "I am nervous and stressed getting all my belongings together, but my horses are feeling great and I know that I have done everything that I can to prepare them and myself."

Going into the WNFR, Weast hopes to win as much money as she can and enjoy every run she makes down the historic alleyway at the Thomas and Mack.

"Bottom line, the NFR makes dreams come true, and I hope that I make it unforgettable."

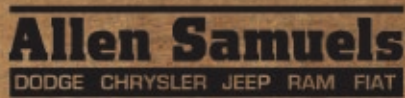

I'm pretty blessed though, I have the best model, she is super affordable and perfect as can be (aka Lauren Lowery aka my wife). I have also set up booths a couple times to sell at Sip N Shops and some shows.

How did you get started?

I actually decided teach myself a few years ago after a lifetime of being around Turquoise in the western industry and being Native American. I have always been into making stuff to sell though. P.S. I feel like I mention everyone but my Mom, she is my biggest support but homegirl ain't crafty (bless her heart).

Why was turquoise your choice of stone for your jewelry? What interest you about it??

For as long as I can remember my Grandma Lowery would buy Turquoise for my sisters and cousins when she was back home in North Carolina for the tribes homecoming. I would hear about how everyone set their booths up and would sell their crafts. When we would go to North Carolina I started to really pay attention to the jewelry and was always fascinated with designs. Whenever I went to New Mexico for the first time several years ago I knew I wanted to learn. I really love the history being the jewelry and the stones as well. So, I would say it's all from my Grandma! Thanks Grandma! Haha!

What is your favorite type of turquoise to work with?

I love Royston. To me it is so pretty to look at. Everyone loves it. It has the best colors. I love that one mine can produce so many different shades that go together so well.

Is there a type that you specifically only use in your designs or do the stones you work with vary in types?

The stones I use really vary. I have customers that request certain stones which makes it hard sometimes to find. People really like Royston though which makes it easy. I just try to stock up on it. For my bigger pieces like Squash Blossoms I use Kingman just because it was easy to get at the time with that make stones that have to match.

What are your favorite pieces to make??

My favorite things to make are pieces like my cuffs that I am kinda known for doing and these Kingman fan earrings I make that create a crescent shape.

Tell me about your recent appearance in the one and only "Cowboys & Indians"

I have been blessed enough to be in 2 issues of Cowboys & Indians recently. The first one was with Gil Birmingham (Yellowstone actor) on the cover and the last one was with George Strait on the cover (you know who that is). Being in this magazine was a dream come true. Ever since I was little I have collected them. So, this was really special and I can't thank them enough for featuring my work.

What pieces of jewelry are your best sellers?

My best sellers are some signature earrings that I make with Kingman Turquoise and my open cuffs that have a stone on each end. I really enjoy making them so maybe they are just my favorite thing to make..... and I just think they are my best seller.

Tells us about some of your favorite pieces you have made so far?

My favorite pieces I have made so far would be my most recent White Buffalo Squash Blossom. It was really fun to make and it came out better than I thought it would. I put a lot of hard work and hours into it so it was exciting to hear the lady I made it for loved it. I also loved this Sleeping Beauty Turquoise cluster ring I made. It featured 15 stones. It was hard to make but I learned a lot from making it.

To wrap up give us a little on why you think Turquoise is such an iconic part of The western world?

If I had to guess, Turquoise is probably so iconic because it has so much history and character. Each stones is so unique in it's shape and color. Each stone has an origin, but may look completely different from other stones out of the same mine. You can collect pieces that feature certain mines. People collect vintage pieces with stories, or pieces that were handed down through generations.

INFORMATION FOR 2018-2019

- In the Breakaway roping event in the G13-15, B13-15 and the G16-19 age groups, the Bell Collar Catch rule will be in effect. There will be a judge assigned to be the official spotter.
- The Girls 16-19 will no longer have a ribbon roping event. In its place, a 2nd Breakaway run will be added. Both breakaway runs will be used to count towards year-end World Championship and RFD Exemption and World Championship All-Around.
- RFD The American Semi-Finals exemptions will be awarded for the 2020 RFD The American Semi-Finals. To qualify for the exemptions, a contestant must pay \$150 for each event that they wish to be eligible in earning an exemption. The money collected would be used to pay the entry fee to the RFD The American Semi-Finals. Winner of exemptions must wear AJRA logo patches which will be provided.
- Team Roping will be referred to as Dally Team Roping. Tie-ons are not allowed.
- Optional Roping saddles in the G9-12, B9-12, G13-15, and B13-15 will be awarded by using the Breakaway and Ribbon Roping points earned.
- 8 & Under Age group will continue to be a boys and girls age group where all contestants will compete together and there will be a separate 8 & Under All Around Cowboy and All Around Cowgirl
- Each event must have at least 5 qualified to compete at the NFR in order to award a saddle. If an event doesn't have 5 NFR qualifies a saddle will not be awarded unless a sponsor is willing to cover the cost of the saddle.
- Any event that does not have at least 5 competitors entered at the NFR, that event will not have the same amount of added money provided to all other events that have 5 or more competitors.
- The B16-19 will continue to have a 2nd Optional Tie-Down event with an entry fee.
 - o There will be no points earned for this 2nd Tie-Down run. No All-Around points will be earned.

The Horse Everyone Knows

We all have that one friend, the friend that everyone knows. It does not seem to matter where you travel with that friend at least one person will either know them personally, have met them previously or know their reputation. For some reason that person makes and leaves an unforgettable impression.

Well, we have that horse that everyone knows, her name is Magic. Magic is a 20-year-old, plus or minus, mare, she is not registered so her true age can only be assumed based on previous owners. Magic is solid black with one white stocking on her left back leg, a snip of white on her right back leg and a white blazed face. Her mane and tail are thick and long, she is broad, tall and as solid looking as a horse can be. With her thick

build, large hoofs and wild mane and tail she almost resembles a bronc. However, nothing could be further from the truth. When you look into her soulful eyes you can see kindness, wisdom, experience and a little bit of sass to round it all out. While Magic naturally has a calmness about her, when it is time to work you can literally see her demeanor and attitude change from calm and cool to game time!

Magic came to be our girl about four years ago. My youngest daughter, Hattie, needed another break-away roping horse and a horse she could also use for goat tying. As most rodeo families do when looking for a horse "you put the word out". In other words, you let it be known to other rodeo families you are

looking for a horse. A few weeks after making it known we were looking for a horse, I received a phone call from a family friend, Dusta Kimzey. Many of you may remember Dusta and her family from one of my previous articles, titled Tricked-out. Dusta and her family are from Strong City, OK. Dusta told me about Magic and suggested we take a look at her. It so happened that same evening we were headed to a goat tying jackpot in Weatherford, OK. Luck was on our side, another rodeo family friend of ours, Kara Bottom, who lived just a few miles from the Kimzey family, was going to bring her two daughters to the jackpot. Kara said she had an open spot in her trailer and would be happy to haul Magic to Weatherford.

That night at the goat tying jackpot, after making a couple of runs on her current horse, my daughter climbed onto Magic and made a run. It was a disaster. Magic veered to the right of the goat and didn't seem to want to stop. After the jackpot Dusta worked with Hattie and Magic and the threesome figured some things out. The next several practice runs, although not perfect, were much better.

After the jackpot was over, we loaded Magic into our trailer and took her home having made a deal with Dusta to let us try Magic for a week to see how she and Hattie got along. We went to a couple of break-away ropings, worked on the goat-tying get-off and just spend time getting to know Magic. At the end of the week we knew Magic Lady would be staying. As the months progressed, team Magic and Hattie started really clicking and our decision to purchase the big black bronc-looking lady went from a good decision to a great decision.

I am not sure when the first "hey I know that horse, that's Magic" was heard, but it seemed no matter where we traveled either in the state of Oklahoma or another state, someone always knew Magic. Either that person had roped on her, tied goats on her, had ridden her or just knew her from either the Kimzey family or her previous owners before the Kimzey family. Prior to becoming part of our family, Magic had been hauled up and down the road to many high school, college and professional rodeos, and she had become the "go-to" horse for anyone and everyone who either had a hurt horse, entered at the last minute with no horse to ride, or just wanted to rope or tie off another horse.

Carly Richardson, a college rodeo friend of Dusta's once pulled into a rodeo in Waynoka, OK. After unloading her horse, she noticed he was lame on one leg. Dusta told her to jump on Magic and rope a calf. Afterwards Carly told Dusty "she was fun"! Another great Cowgirl, Alex Christen had this to say about Magic. A horse is a projection of people's dreams about themselves; strong, powerful and beautiful; under the ownership of two women I know, Magic portrays those dreams in every stride she takes!

Magic was originally owned by Bob Nunn (Hunter Herrin's dad) Apache, OK, before being purchased by the Packard family for their son Tanner, Magic was then five years old. Over the next 9 years Tanner and Magic won and placed in many calf ropings. Magic was not for sale the day Dusta saw and fell in love with her. Somehow, she convinced Tan-

ner to sell Magic and he agreed knowing she would be loved and have a great home. Originally Dusta wanted to use Magic for trick-riding. However, Magic did not agree. It was her instinct to stop when Dusta would hang off her side and/or stand up. Magic won that battle and for the next six years she was hauled up and down the road and used for a calf roping, break-away and goat tying horse. In 2014 our family purchased Magic. Today Magic is the main goat-tying horse and the back-up break-away horse.

Magic's appearance alone makes her stand out in a crowd. However, much like the human person that everyone knows, Magic's reputation has not been based solely on her looks. Magic has earned her reputation for being the kind of horse that people can rely on. Magic steps up to the job at hand and gives it ev-

everything she has. The big mare is solid, stout, dependable and has the heart of a true champion.

Respect is not a given, respect is earned. In my opinion Magic has earned respect. Our family will forever be grateful we have been blessed to have such a horse in our family. Someday Magic will retire and when she does she will forever have a stall in our barn until the day the Good Lord decides he needs another great horse in his herd!

COLLECTORS CORNER: LITTLE BIG HORN GUN?

Recently a Single Action Colt Army (SAA) with the very low serial number(s) 5089 came to us. My first reaction was, "WOW! could that possibly be a Custer (7th Cavalry/Little Bighorn) gun? Here is what was found out. There is an interesting story here.

First off, there are only a handful of documented 7th Cavalry guns in existence. There has been a plethora of research done on the subject, and probably the most noted experts in this field would be John Kopec and the late, Dr. H. Sterling Fenn, the duo wrote, *Colt, Cavalry & Artillery Revolvers, a Continuing Study* (with approx. half of the book dedicated to Custer's 7th Cavalry Colts).

In the book, they explain much of the research that has gone into narrowing down a serial number range of Colt SAA's that have a high probability of being 7th Cavalry revolvers. That most desirable serial number range according to the research is from a shipment which contained serial numbers 4500 thru 5504. The book goes on to state that in later half of 1874, there were 755 new Colt SAA revolvers issued to the 7th Cavalry and that about 600 of them came from the shipment which contained serial numbers 4500 thru 5504 (or about six out of every ten revolvers in that shipment).

In the book they state, "Very few documented or positively-associated Seventh Cavalry Colts are known." They list some numbers from that serial number range of 4500 thru 5504 with a positive association: 4507, 4553, 4597, 5100, 5128 and 5147. They go on to list a number of revolvers with, "strong, but less positive Seventh Cavalry association" from that shipment and they are numbers: 4729, 4949, 4955, 5133, 5153, 5180 and 5416. There are others with good possibilities, but less documentation. Read on.

At the time of issue, Colt SAA revolvers were shipped to the armory in crates containing fifty to a crate. It is assumed the serial numbers in each crate were "of similar chronological serial numbers, but were not necessarily in exact sequence." Therefore, if you come across a gun with a serial number in the range of within 50 numbers of a documented 7th Cavalry revolver, it stands to reason that your odds increase that you have a possible "Little Bighorn" or "7th Cavalry" gun. You can see why we were excited to see revolver #5089 come in! (Revolver #5100 was actually a Little Big Horn Battlefield find, dug up in the 1980s.) A number of other serial numbers close to 5089 have also been analyzed and are believed to have "strong possible" association with the Seventh Cavalry and the Little Bighorn for a variety of reasons.

Now, let's look at 5089. It is not without problems. Its overall condition would be considered "fair" in our opinion. At a glance, you will notice it does not have the original grips or butt strap and has a 5.5" barrel. The loading gate has been nicked at some point and pretty much all of the finish is gone. Then, with further examination, you will see the serial number 5089 on the cylinder is faint (as is the inspectors initials AP). The barrel also has a small A P inspector's initials (which would be correct). Both of these things are good. However, the 5089 on the bottom of the frame and trigger guard are deep and easily read. The two-line patent dates on the left side of the frame have been obliterated, but there is an easily read "US" over where the patent dates should be. Hmmm.

After some digging and closer examination, we find the serial numbers on the bottom of the frame and trigger guard and the US on the left side of the frame have been re-applied by someone at some point. Why would they do such a thing?

There are a couple of possibilities. One is that a "backyard" restoration was done where the person was trying to make them look better because it was hard to read and they did not know that any kind of "restoration" like this hurts the value. The other possibility is down right deception. There are people out there who try to "help" things along so they can get more money for something by making it seem like something it is not.

The person who brought the revolver to us claimed to have owned it since the late 1980s and that he found it in an antique shop in Pennsylvania. He knew nothing of the alterations and seemed surprised to find out about them. I actually spoke to John Kopec about this revolver on the phone. He told me he has files on over 6,000 Colt SAA's that he has either come into contact with or been sent information on over the years. Some Colts had been sent into him for examination, while others he might have just seen at a gun show somewhere and made a few notes on. He did have a file on 5089 with a few notes!

John was quick to point out the discrepancies listed above, but

could not remember where he might have seen it and he hadn't any notes to that effect. Being a purist, John was pretty down on the alterations or "help" that had been done to it, but he also admitted, "it does fall in a very desirable serial number range."

That brings us back to the million dollar question, "what has happened to this revolver and where has it been?" One of the questionable items mentioned above is the two-line patent dates on the left side of the frame missing. However, on page 283 of Kopec's book, under the section, *Historically Associated Seventh Cavalry Colts*, it states, "Serial numbers 5020, 5065, 5099 and 6066 are included for comment, since each has had the 'U.S.' and part or all of the patent date markings obliterated. Serial number 5128, which has documented Indian oral history indicating capture at the Little Bighorn, also has an obliterated 'U.S.' marking. Four of these revolvers show rough Indian use and are in the mid-serial number range estimated for primary issue to the Seventh Cavalry. It also is interesting to note that four of these revolvers, #5020, #5065, #5099 and #5128 are in very close serial number proximity, and one is consecutive, to serial-number 5100 which was recently recovered at the Custer Battlefield."

Interesting. So several other Colts with very similar serial numbers also had their patent dates and U.S. markings rubbed off (probably because they were Indian capture guns). Did 5089 meet the same fate as its brethren of close-serial-number proximity? Who knows.

If it was an Indian capture gun, then shouldn't it still have the 7.5" barrel and not a 5.5"? That is a good question. Another possibility is that it was turned in for an Artillery remodel in the late 1890s. Most Colt collectors know that Artillery models usually have mixed serial numbers and 5089 has matching numbers. However, we refer to the book, *Cavalry & Artillery Revolvers* again and it says, "In November of 1895,

1,200 revolvers were returned by the Army to Colt for refurbishing. They were re-worked to be made serviceable again and had their barrels shortened to 5.5" (from 7.5"). These types of Colts are widely known as "Artillery" models. The special thing about these 1,200 Colt SAA, Artillery models is that special care was taken to mostly keep their serial numbers in tact (or matching) unlike the second batch of 14,900 Colt SAA revolvers that were sent back for refurbishing between 1896 and 1903. These later Artillery models are of almost exclusively mixed serial numbers as no care was given in keeping them together."

If only this Colt could talk. Tell us where it's been. Was it a 7th Cavalry issue like six out of ten of its brothers from the same shipment? So many others with very close serial numbers seem to have either positive or strong association with the 7th. Was it an Indian capture gun from the battle of the Little Bighorn who had its U.S. markings rubbed off and then some bonehead, at a later date, not knowing what he was doing, tried to re-apply some of them? Is there some other wild story why the patent markings would have been obliterated? Who knows.

There is a strong possibility that part (at least 50% and more likely 75% of this gun being original) was a 7th Cavalry issue and therefore at the Little Bighorn. How does the alterations and replacement parts affect the value? Obviously it does. Documented Colts with Kopec letters of authenticity stating positive association have sold at auction anywhere from the \$30,000 range to over \$400,000! (Condition and provenance played a major role in the wide sales amount ranges.) An unaltered Colt with a fairly strong association would probably be expected to fetch at least \$10,000 to \$15,000. Any Colt with a serial number of under ten-thousand should sell for at least \$7,500 to \$10,000. So what about this one? Well, we are going to find out what collectors think. It goes to auction on Jan. 5th, 2019. It will be interesting to see what happens.

Guidelines for Feeding and Caring for Horses in Winter Weather

As winter weather approaches, care and management of the horse may change due to the increased need for energy and shelter. As temperatures begin to fall with the possibilities of rain, snow, ice, and wind, increased management will become necessary to maintain the well-being and overall general health of the horse through increased feeding practices as well as making certain that proper shelter is provided.

As with all mammals, horses must maintain their body temperatures to survive. This is generally accomplished through consumption of feed and forage to produce energy for the body to perform daily functions such as metabolism, locomotion, and maintenance of body heat. The environmental temperature and heat produced by the body determine how much heat must be conserved by the horse. When the horse is within its thermal comfort zone, the body does little to regulate heat generation and heat loss. In other words, when the outdoor temperature is above a certain point, the horse produces more heat than is needed to maintain its core body temperature and therefore, energy in the body is used for other things such as digestion, growth, tissue turnover and maintenance, gestation, lactation, walking, galloping, etc.

The thermal comfort zone is unique to all horses because there are several factors that determine what the comfort zone shall be. The lower threshold of the thermal comfort zone is referred to as the lower critical temperature. The lower critical temperature for the horse can be defined as the lowest environmental outdoor temperature that the horse can generally tolerate before increased energy needs or shelter is required. Factors that affect the lower critical temperature of the individual mature horse include but are not limited to temperature, precipitation, wind speed, hair coat length, and shelter.

Mature horses weighing approximately 1000 lbs found in the Southern United States with moderate body condition scores will reach their lower critical temperature between 30° and 60°F given that there is little to no precipitation and wind under five miles per hour. Specifically, horses with wet or short hair coats will reach their lower critical temperature at ~60°F. Horses with moderate to heavy hair coats will reach their lower critical temperature at ~50° to ~30°F respectively. When these thresholds are met, individual energy needs will increase by 1% for every 1°F below the critical temperature point. Therefore, if wind-chill causes the effect of the outdoor temperature to feel like 20°F, given the horse has a heavy winter coat and a low-

er critical temperature of 30°F, then the horse will have an increased energy requirement of ~10% or 2Mcal/day. If wind speed reaches 15 miles per hour, ~20 ~40% or 4 to 8 Mcal/d will be required in additional energy given that there is no precipitation. If wind conditions are mild but precipitation occurs, ~30% or 6 Mcal/day increased energy will be required. Finally, if wind and precipitation are both present at 30°F, energy needs will increase by ~50% - ~70% or 10 to 14 Mcal/day.

Proper shelter is one way to protect the horse from reaching a lower critical temperature by reducing or alleviating the effects of wind and precipitation. If sheds are to be placed in pastures or paddocks, it is important that they are secure and safe for all horses. Barns and stalls are also good options to keeping horses warm, dry, and safe. However, if horses are to be kept in barns with short hair coats, it should be recognized that lower critical temperature points will be much higher for these types of horses and should be considered when these horses are turned out.

Feeding horses properly in winter conditions may require some management adjustments compared to other times of the year. It is widely accepted that increasing forage in colder weather is a good management practice due to the increased heat value as compared to feeding additional grain. The reason for this is due to the bacterial fermentation process that takes place in the cecum and large intestine that creates more heat to provide warmth to the body of the horse.

Strategy In Your Bull Riding...

I don't care who you are or what you say, my era of professional bull riders did not learn to ride rank bulls by being exposed to a high number of rank bulls at a young age. Believe it or not bull riding is like any other sport when it comes to training the youth up to greatness at the professional level. Low caliber bulls give riders during their developmental years a chance to implement things they learn without the danger level being so great that if they make a mistake they will pay for it with their health.

Anyone that you've heard of in the world of professional bull riding will tell you that they learned more in the developmental stage by riding lower level bulls. Being exposed to rank bulls must be done with some strategy. Dominating at each level is very important in developing a solid career. Rank bulls are fine in moderation but not every crack out of the gate even after a guy has had some success on rank ones he should still practice on a lot of low level bulls. Staying honest to the fundamentals of bull riding is very important but is best done on low level bulls.

My generation of guys was able to get on a lot of low level bulls even in competition. The bulls used at rodeos and bull ridings back then were a bunch of low level bulls with a few that could be considered buckers and even fewer that were rank. In the world of bull riding today because of the large number of high quality bulls a guy must seek out low level bulls to help the "between the ears" part of our sport.

If you will go at bull riding with some strategy to dominate and patience in advancement at each level you will give yourself the best chance to become a real bull rider at the highest levels of bull riding. Don't just follow the crowd because there is a bus load of talented guys headed over the cliff created by the born-to-buck world, never to be heard of in the world of pro bull riding. Some Parents, Leaders of some Youth Associations and some Bull Guys are the ones driving the bus headed toward the cliff. Have a bit of strategy people.
